⁽¹⁾ The Department of Housing and Community Development is expected to be the conduit issuer of Infrastructure Bonds for the following jurisdictions: Town of Berlin, City of Cambridge, City of Cumberland, Town of Federalsburg, Town of Forest Heights, Town of Middletown, City of New Carrollton, Somerset Sanitary Comm. and City of Takoma Park.

⁽²⁾ MWQRLF = Maryland Water Quality Revolving Loan Fund. The Maryland Water Quality Financing Administration provides loans to local governments for wastewater and drinking water treatment facilities using revenue bonds and other fund sources.

⁽³⁾ USDA = United States Department of Agriculture Loan. The United States Department of Agriculture provides loans for construction of wastewater treatment plants.

⁽⁴⁾ TIF = Tax Incremental Financing Bonds. Public financing method that is used as a subsidy for redevelopment, infrastructure, and other community-improvement projects.
